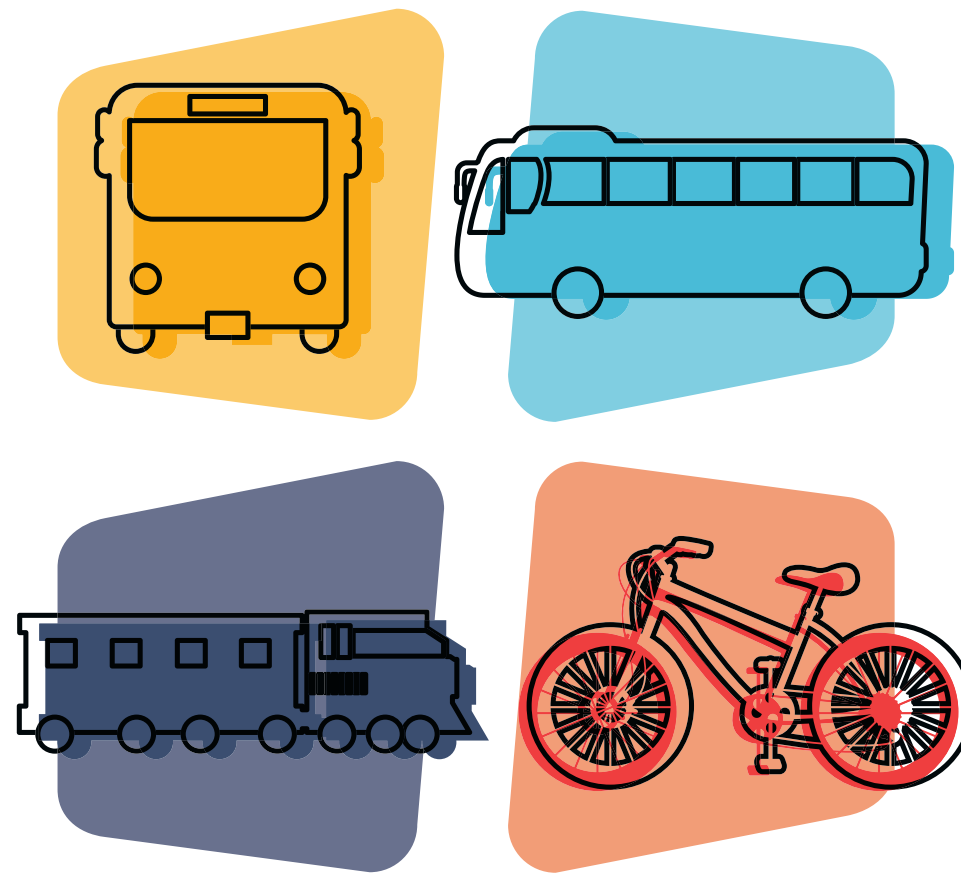

Departures Sat 13th July AM

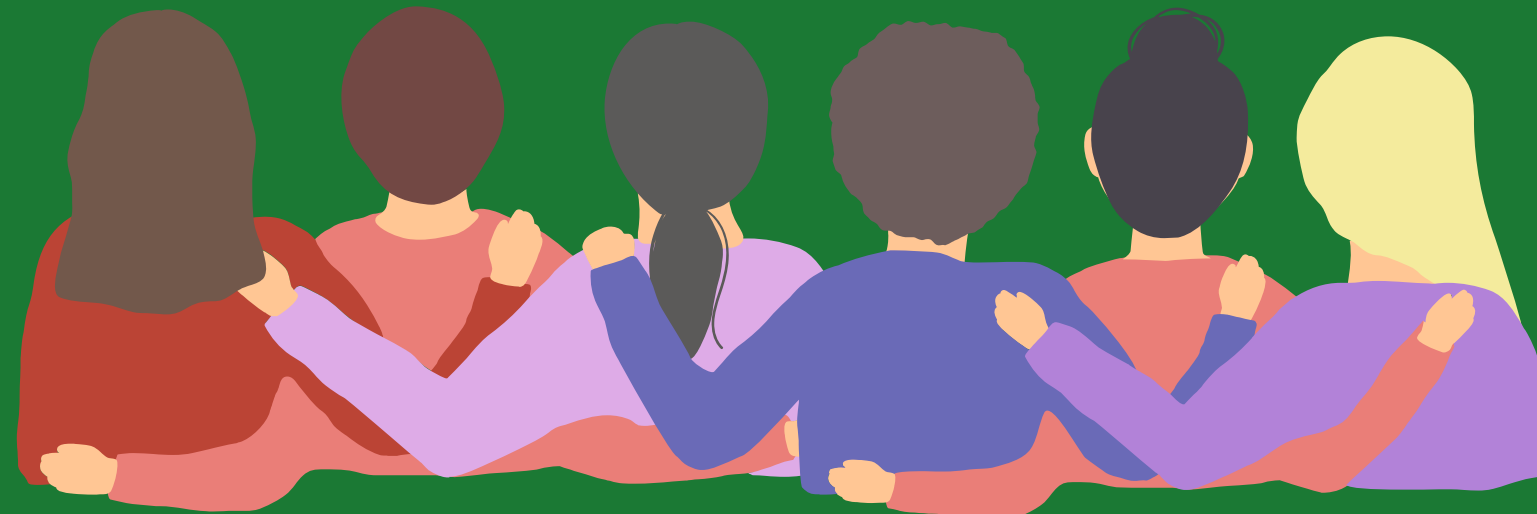
